Our Banner is to be displayed at all Annual Sessions of Gild Wassails. A mold was made of the mayors ring fashioned by our first Mayor William S. Guitteau. (1937-41) making possible the purchase of the mayors ring by any and all P.M.'S.

Annual dues were increased from \$65.00 to \$85.00. Greybeard dues from \$5.00 to \$10.00. Fiscal year was changed from Oct. 31 to Sept. 30. Membership was at 320--the limit was 325.

A Banquet was planned to celebrate our 50th Anniversary in the year of 1987. The Gild lamp was presented to A.G.A. Chairman 1984 Cliff Davis. 1985 Lou Reif.
